
## Lousy Liver

#### **INTRODUCTION**

Reader's Theatre is a dramatic reading of a written work in script form. Students are encouraged to read from a "script" with parts to be read divided among the readers. Unlike a standard dramatic presentation, no special costuming, lighting, set design, or line memorization is necessary. Presentations can easily be performed within a classroom simply by placing emphasis on the text with expressive voice and gesture. It is a unique way to foster students' connection to the text. Narrator #5: Like a big hungry lion out on the prowl.


Charlie's Mom: Ta da!

Charlie: What a horrible plan!


It was simple as that.

Narrator #6: He pushed it around with his tongue all about.


Narrator #7: He mashed it. He smashed it. He swallowed it down.
